

FIX-O-FLEX Primer

Properties:

FIX-O-FLEX Primer is a solvent-containing adhesive agent on a polyurethane basis that should be applied before processing FIX-O-FLEX adhesive and sealing compounds on absorbent subsurfaces such as concrete, clinker, porous concrete, cement asbestos, plaster and natural stone (marble, granite etc.).

The application of *FIX-O-FLEX Primer* is prescribed for jointing with *FIX-O-FLEX H* in compliance with DIN 18540-F.

Storage : cool and dry between 5° and 25°C, 9 months in closed

original containers

Processing:

The subsurface must be dry, hard, stable, unsoiled and free of separating substances (grease, oil etc.). Subsurfaces must be free of substances containing tar as this would reduce adhesion. *FIX-O-FLEX bonding adhesive* is a suitable solvent for cleaning surfaces.

FIX-O-FLEX Primer is evenly applied on the surface with a brush or a roller. The selected FIX-O-FLEX adhesion and sealing compounds can be applied after the flash off time .

FIX-O-FLEX Primer contains solvents and isocyanates. The precautionary measures and safety recommendations included in the Safety Data Sheet must be read and understood prior to starting work.
